1. Welcome

2. Volunteer activity the last 2 months

River: It is likely there will be some work required towards autumn and winter to cut back vegetation in the stream to help it flow. Dates to be advised. Also Floating Pennywort, a very invasive plant is growing in parts of the River Wandle. We are awaiting training dates to be advised by SERT South East River Trust which are expected to be I September in the Wandle in Morden Hall Park.

3. New projects

- Bee Beds in The Rec: Zoe is managing this and outlined the plans for planting the currently dormant beds in the Rec, near the Cavendish Road entrance. The large bed in particular will have a focus on bee pollinating plants. We are aiming for the large bed to have a central Rowan tree surrounded by planting that provides flowers as much as possible across the whole year. In addition, the wall will be rebuilt and we hope to have bug and bee hotels built into these walls. We have applied for funding from the Bee Keepers Association, idverde's Community Investment Fund and the ward fund available to local councillors to fund this project. The 2 adjacent much smaller beds will also be planned and planted. We aim to raise these beds off the ground. Idverde are going to increase the height of the football fencing adjacent to these beds so that plants are not destroyed by flying footballs and tennis balls.
- Beds/Green near the bus stop on the High Street at the junction with Byegrove Road, next to
 Tesco and opposite the library: This new project is being managed by Tom. This is Clarion
 owned land but Mark Holmes from LB Merton has been in touch and asked our group if we
 would be interested in looking after this area. A 'High Street Flower Meadow' is one of the ideas
 being discussed.
- 4. Splitting into project subgroups and confirming leaders (Share screen)

As a group, we are taking on more and more gardening projects so it has been decided that it would be useful to have group coordinators for each area then each group leader can feedback information about their project are the bi-monthly meetings.

So that we can plan planting for 2022, ACTION: Can all group coordinators check their areas and advise what gaps they have and what new plants are needed so we can create an order list order for now or spring.

5. idverde meeting

The Friends Committee met with the idverde team in August to discuss activity mostly in The Rec. Full notes were taken and shared with idverde but these are the main points discussed:

- Greenflag Award: for The Rec is up for renewal in 2022
- All ideverde activity is based on a park management Plan managed by Jonathan Turner, Perks team LM Merton. From this monthly task sheets are provided to the idverde ground team.
- **Perimeter bed pruning:** Following the severe prusing in Spring 2021, it was agreed that from 2022 bushes are to be cut just once in the year, in October. It is currently twice a year.
- **G5 Power Station Communication Cabinet**: (near tennis courts): Photinia (Red Robin) will be planted here shortly to disguise the cabinet.
- Beds near the Cavendish Road Entrance: i.e. 2 small beds + 1 large bed. The latter was planned
 to be 12 months dormant following removal of bindweed and diseased box hedge. Ideverde are
 happy for the Friends group to suggest plans for these beds to include pollinating plants that will
 attract bees. An extension net will raise the height of the safety net at the rear of the tennis
 courts.
- Clarendon Road Entrance: repairs needed to the knee rail/wooden railings
- Wandle Park Grass Cutting: The Friends group will meet Ian Baxter (idverde) and mark-out the
 wild flower and grass meadow area that is to be kept longer to encourage biodiversity and
 habitat.

6. Support from Sainsbury's

We are grateful to Sainsbury's who have been donating their non-saleable dying plants to us which we are nursing back to life and planting out in the local area. We have produced a document to thank Sainsburys which includes photos of plants donated and explains how they have supported our local community.

Volunteer Activity July and August

GARDENING GROUPS:

On 15 July we cut back dead shrubs and weeded the large bed in the Rec behind the tennis courts that backs onto Woodlands Nursing Home. We removed 12 bags of vegetation.

On 31 July we started work on the jungle on the High Street, recently re-named as the High Street Flower Meadow (i.e. the Beds/Green near the bus stop on the High Street at the junction with Byegrove Road, next to Tesco and opposite the library). We removed and dug up the invasive bindweed and cleared the area of rubbish. Although owned by Clarion, the plan is to plant up this area and create a wild flower meadow. On Saturday 28th August, we returned and removed yet more bindweed, pulled out the tall nettles/thistles from the roots, cut back the shoots from the base of the trees, dug up the gladioli bulbs to replant elsewhere next year and clipped back the small hedges along the back border. Our most recent visit was on 2 September, to collect up the grass cuttings as it had been mowed a couple of days earlier. We also re-defined some of the borders and removed yet more weeds and litter.

On 5th August we were back in the Memorial Garden in the Rec. We weeded and cutback shrubs and also cleared an adjacent bed which will now be ready to take more plants. On the 19th we adopted a bush donated by Sarah from the group which we replanted in the memorial garden. We think it is probably Ceratostigma plumbaginoides (Plumbago or leadwort).

PLUS There has also been some other ad-hoc work where individuals or small groups have self-organized and worked on weeding and tidying-up the Johmad Nursery bed in the high street, the Acre Road Planters, Singlegate Close beds and Myrna Close/Devonshire road Walk through.

RIVER GROUP

On 9 July a group of 9 of us removed 3 shopping trolleys, several bags of litter and a huge amount of Himalayan Balsam, from the River Wandle as it flows to the east of and in front of Sainsburys. This plant may look pretty with large pink flowers but it is very invasive and can choke rivers. We pulled up from the roots and left the removed plants on the bank for them to decompose and allow native plants to grow over.

On 24th we also cleared away a huge amount of Himalayan Balsam, as well as litter, from the River Wandle and the marshy banks in Wandle Park.

LITTER GROUPS

The litter group went litter picking on 13th July meeting outside Sainsbury's and made their way along the bank of the Wandle up to Windsor Avenue. They collected 14 sacks of litter and a car tyre! They revisited this area again on 25th July and 22nd August again collecting several bags of recycling and litter. On 10th August the litter group headed to Myrna Close nature reserve and collected 8 bags of litter from the paths there.
